The Wildlife Vet will be responsible for the following duties:

- Provide medical assessment, triage and treatment for a wide range of Tasmanian native wildlife, including diagnosis, surgery, anaesthesia, post-operative care, and rehabilitation.
- Manage and monitor the overall health and well-being of animals in captivity or under human care, including those in wildlife rehabilitation and supporting wildlife rehabilitators in the region as required.
- Assist in development and implementation of health management plans for wildlife populations in coordination with other conservation agencies.
- Record and collate data for disease surveillance of native wildlife populations.
- Work closely with wildlife rehabilitation staff and volunteers, providing guidance and training on animal handling, care, and rehabilitation techniques.
- Collaborate with government agencies, non-governmental organisations, and other stakeholders to develop and implement conservation initiatives and wildlife management programs.
- Conduct or participate in research projects related to wildlife health, disease, ecology, and conservation, with an emphasis on Tasmania's unique species and ecosystems.
- Develop and maintain accurate records of animal cases, treatments, and outcomes, ensuring compliance with relevant laws, regulations, and guidelines.
- In coordination with other team members participate in public outreach and education initiatives to promote awareness and understanding of wildlife health, conservation, and responsible coexistence with native species.
- Maintain professional knowledge and skills through continuing education, conferences, workshops, and professional memberships.
